How to Register

On-line registration can be found on our website at www.martensville.ca, look for the 'Program Registrations' button. In person and phone registration will take place at the Martensville Athletic Pavilion, however we are closed August 8th-20th for maintenance. What is it?

KidSport is a children's charity dedicated to assisting children ages 5-18. Families facing financial obstacles will be provided with the opportunity to participate in community sport programs. The primary goal of KidSport should be for ALL kids to play and have fun!



How Does the Program Work?

Individual grants of up to \$750 are available per calendar year for children or youth up to the age of 18. Application forms for KidSport are available at the MAP.

Sask. Lotteries Community Grant

The purpose of the Sask. Lotteries Community Grant program is to provide funds to local, non-profit and volunteer-based organizations whose sole purpose is to provide programs and services in the sport, culture, or recreation sector. The project or event must take place between April 1st and Mar. 31st of the following year. Applications are accepted in February each year.



Recreation Membership & Program Accessibility

This program will offer a discounted rate on yearly recreation facility memberships at the MAP and city operated leisure programs for families and individuals whose income is below a certain level.

The discounted membership will be 50% off the original price of a yearly membership at the Martensville Athletic Pavilion. The discounted leisure program registration will be 80% off the original price of the city offered leisure program, up to a maximum of \$200 per family member per year.

Families or individuals looking to apply for this program must complete the application form and provide all required documents. All information on the forms provided by the participants will be strictly confidential. Applications are available at City Hall and the MAP. This program is only for City of Martensville residents.

Art Classes - Beginner

This class will be an exploration of art and an introduction to different mediums. Each child will learn techniques with pencil, charcoal, pastels, and acrylic paint. We will spend two weeks on each art form and complete a piece of art in each medium to take home. Students can pick from pictures provided to create their masterpieces! Each student will receive individual help to advance their abilities as they work on their artwork. Join us for some fun!

Art Classes – Painting

Once you've mastered the art basics in my Beginner Art Class, you can move into the Painting Class. This class will explore both water color and acrylic painting techniques. SMBA Basketball

The Saskatoon Minor Basketball Association offers a development program for all ages. You can register for the 2023-2024 Fall/Winter League at https://leagues.teamlinkt.com/smba. Registration will be on-line only and closes September 2nd with an option for late registrations until September 15th. The league will run from mid-October to mid-March with a break over Christmas. Teams will practice in Martensville but will play games in Saskatoon on Saturdays. If you are interested in coaching you will also have to register on-line. - **Spuds (Grade 3 & 4)** The spuds season runs from mid-October to mid-February. The coaches referee the games, and the kids play 4 on 4. There are no play-offs for Spuds, so the season wraps up in February.
- Minis (Grade 5 & 6) The season runs from mid-October to Mid/End of February which is followed by playoffs in March. All teams make the playoffs and referees are provided for all games
- Bantam (Grade 7 & 8) The season runs from mid-October to Mid/End of February which is followed by playoffs in March. All games are full court and referees are provided.
- Junior (Grade 9 & 10) The season runs from mid-December to Mid March followed by playoffs. All teams make the playoffs. All games are full court and referees are provided.
- Senior (Grade 11 & 12) The season runs from Mid December to Mid March which is followed by
 playoffs in March. All teams make the playoffs. All games are full court and referees are provided.
- Next Level Development League for Mini (Gr. 5 & 6) & Bantam (Gr. 7 & 8) A more competitive league that gives athletes a chance to compete against their peers of the same skill level. The players will be independently evaluated for this program. The evaluation sessions will be September 9 & 10 and September 16 & 17. The league will be drafted based on skill level, regardless of home location in the city. Teams will practice two times per week, and play once per week

Line Dancing

Line Dancing is a fun social activity, promoting exercise, helping to develop and/or maintain posture, balance, coordination, and memory. A line dance is a choreographed dance with a repeated sequence of steps in which a group of people dance in one or more lines or rows. There are no partners and anyone of any age and gender can line dance. In the class, all participants will face the same direction, and execute the pattern of steps at the same time. Music of all genres – classic, country, pop, Latin, modern....; rhythms – waltz, two-step, polka, jive, Charleston, foxtrot, cha cha, rumba, swing, street dance, rap...



Ultra Beginner: No Previous Experience Required. Steps generally taught: walking forward and back, grapevine, step together, jazz box, jazz box ¼ turn right, heel dig, heel splits, toe touch, toe fan, rocking steps, rocking chair, stomp, shuffle forward, vine right and left, ¼ turn right and left, triple step, scuff, brush, hip bumps... (16, 24, 32)

Beginner levels: Previous dance experience and knowledge required (completed ultra beginner). Simple dance style turns and rhythms. Steps generally taught: hook, heel splits, Mambo forward – back – side, weave, toe struts, Pivot turns, ¼ turn, jazz box ¼ turn left, coaster step, Lock step shuffle forward, Lock step shuffle back, kick ball change, Lindy, skate, scissor step, Sailor step, ¼ turn Sailor step, ¼ Monterey, Rolling Vine, Turning Shuffle, Restarts. (16, 24, 32, 40)

Improver: Previous line dance experience and knowledge is required (completed beginner levels). Steps and dance patterns, turns and foot work are complex, with complex dance style and rhythm. Steps generally taught: traveling steps, Diagonal position, Diamond turn, ½ Monterey, ½ turn sailor, turning right and left in combination, vaudeville steps, samba steps, ¾ turn, ¾ on spot turn..... Tags and/or restarts in music. (32, 40, 48, 64)

Intermediate: This is the most popular level of social line dance and this classification will feature dance routines suitable for experienced dancers. Basically dancers who have completed beginner and improver dance and mastered a comprehensive range of step patterns, body position/movements and dance rhythms. An intermediate routine is likely to feature interesting step combinations, pauses, syncopations, body movements, timing variations and styling. (i.e. Heel Jack, Apple Jacks, Vaudeville Step, Dorothy Step, Mashed Potato, Full turn +, Hesitation, Pencil or Spiral Turns, Mule kicks....). Tags, phrase and restarts in music. ...(32, 40, 48, 64, 80, 96, 102...)

Cemetery


The site is located east of Martensville at the south-east corner of Township Road 384 and Range Road 3052. Outdoor Pickleball & Tennis Courts

Off-Leash Dog Park

Users of the Off Leash Dog Park will find a large open space for dogs to run as well as pathways within the treed area of the park. Residents can access the park by vehicle and by foot using the pedestrian bridge off the paths behind Glenview Cove.



Lions Park

Lions Park is located at 416 6th Avenue South and is a popular park for family gatherings, with plenty to offer for young and old. Since 2013, this park has featured Spray Park with 17 different spray features and concrete basin. The Spray Park opens the first weekend in June and runs until the Tuesday after the September long weekend. Hours of operation are 10:00am-8:00pm. Another feature of Lions Park is the newly constructed gazebo. The gazebo provides needed shelter and an area to host family outings or special events. Plenty of green space is also available for a variety of games.

The Lions Park Playground received a significant upgrade in the summer of 2023 that included the installation of rubber surfacing and additional equipment, including accessible swings. The upgrade also included the addition of a Playtop Street iOval. The iOval is an interactive rubberized play area programmed with a variety of games designed to challenge as well as enhance coordination and collaborative play. 
