MARTENSVILLE BAPTIST CHURCH SIGN

It is the responsibility of the property owner to ensure the sign is: located properly within the boundaries of the property; and outside the 4.5 metre sight triangle. This requirement may necessitate the hiring of a professional land surveyor to identify the location property lines.”

DISCUSSION ITEMS

A) RFD – Commercial Property Tax Abatement Program for 2018

Community Economic Development Manager, Dillon Shewchuk reviewed with City Council a proposed Commercial Property Tax Abatement Program for 2018 which would assist Commercial Properties that were impacted by the 2017 Revaluation Year. Local Commercial Businesses and Properties that filed to appeal their assessment in 2017 would be eligible from the program. Businesses and Properties that appealed in 2017 would not be eligible. Eligible Businesses would initiate and undertake the appeals process. Local Commercial Businesses and Properties that successfully appeal their assessment in 2018 will have the corresponding amount of municipal taxes paid in 2017 retroactively abated in the form of a credit to their business' taxes. Also any Commercial Businesses or Properties that may already be receiving a tax exemption will not be eligible for this program. It was noted that School Taxes cannot be retroactively abated and as per the current policy "An appeal against your assessment value does not exempt from paying taxes on time or from late payment penalties". City Council was pleased with the suggestions made and advised Administration to proceed with finalizing the program prior to final approval.

B) Martensville/Warman Chamber of Commerce

Community Economic Development Manager, Dillon Shewchuk reviewed with City Council the proposed amalgamation of the Martensville Chamber of Commerce and Warman Chamber of Commerce. Their goal is to be the voice of the Warman, Martensville & area business region and represent businesses through advocacy, education, and networking, to build and promote a strong and prosperous economic region. Both groups plan to hold Open Houses to provide members the opportunity to learn more about the proposed amalgamation and on October 4th members will have the opportunity to vote on whether or not the amalgamation will take place.

C) RFD – Martensville Neighbourhood Watch Program

City Clerk, Carla Budnick reviewed with City Council a request that came from the Martensville Neighbourhood Watch Group. Their first meeting is set to be held on Monday September 25th 2017 at 7:30 pm at the North Ridge Centennial Community Centre and the group is looking for some financial assistance from the City. City Clerk Budnick noted that there was no money budgeted for in 2017 to assist the group, but did suggest donating the use of the meeting room, helping out with advertising on City Website and Facebook, printing off notice of meeting and printing off some "Know Your Neighbour" sheets. It was suggested that City Council consider budgeting money in 2018 to offer assistance with the program. City Council was okay with what was offered and will reevaluate during the 2018 Budget Deliberations.

D) RFD – Transportation Master Plan

Director of Infrastructure and Planning, Joe Doxey presented City Council with the final Transportation Master Plan. The plan provides sixty nine recommendations which are broken up into recommended timelines based on current or projected projects. The list of sixty nine recommendations will be brought to the next Committee of the Whole meeting for City Council to review and prioritize.

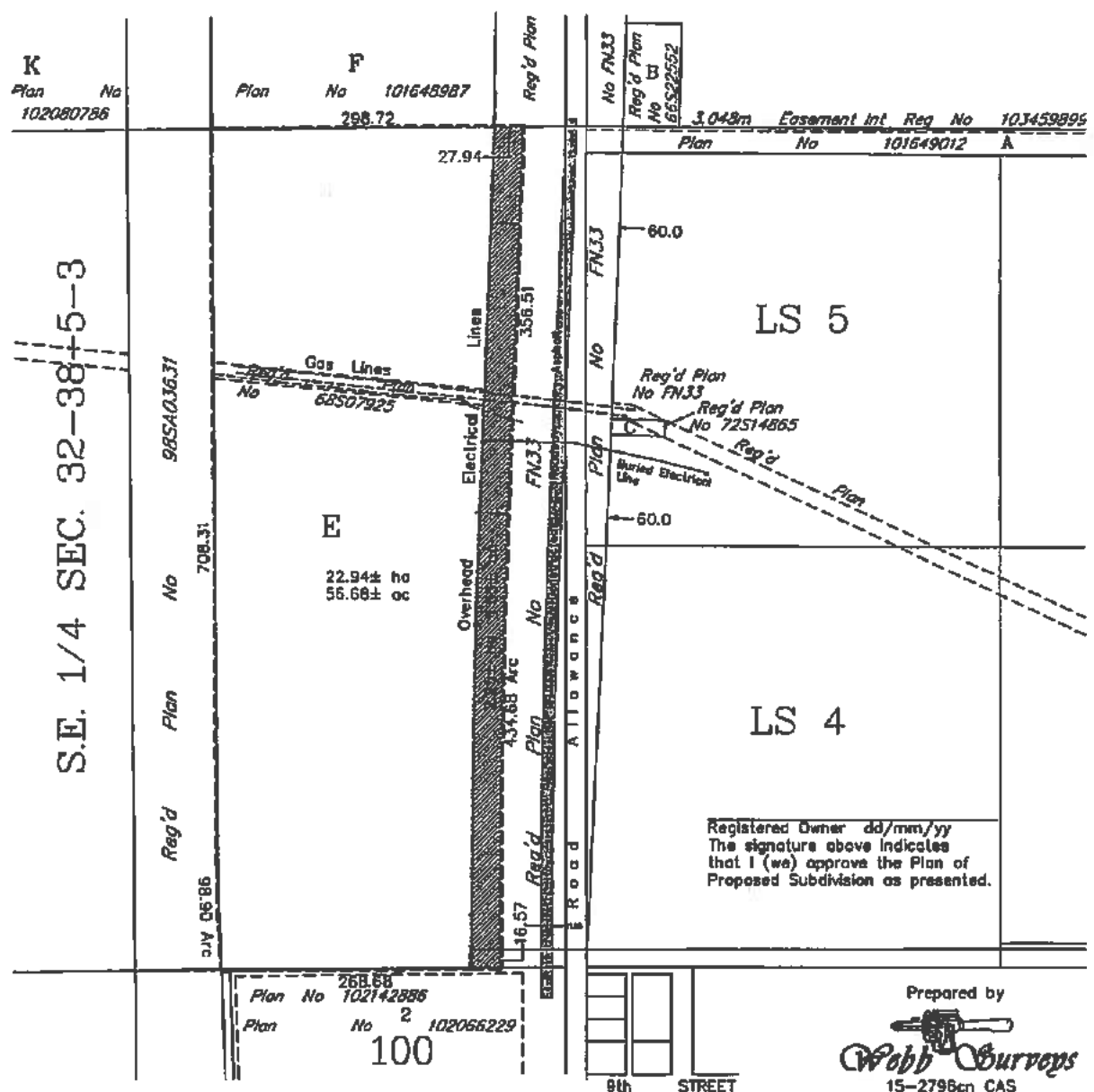
PLAN OF PROPOSED SUBDIVISION

Dear Mayor Muench:

The in-car digital video system (ICDVS) new solution is an updated video technology designed for installation and use within police vehicles. The ICDVS aids in capturing evidence and enhances both public and officer safety. This equipment records police and public interactions, accurately capturing important footage, which can be referenced during investigations and public complaints. The use of video evidence has a proven positive impact on judicial proceedings by enhancing case information and providing the best evidence possible.

This fiscal year, the roll out of the in car video equipment will have an immediate impact on the budgets of all municipalities under 15,000 population as it will increase the pooled cost base. The impact on your municipality will be \$1,150 per FTE member. As a result, the maximum total impact to your municipal policing budget is \$9,200 at the contract rate, if your establishment were full. It is important to note that actual expenditures will only reflect your working member utilization. I also want to highlight that these costs will only be realized and charged to your Municipality as the equipment becomes operational.

Unfortunately, the costs associated to the roll-out of the in-car video were not forecasted for this fiscal year; however, they have been included in future multi-year plans. Initial installations of the video system are planned for areas that are located near RCMP Traffic Units, including Municipal Detachments. As part of the planned deployment of the servers and cameras, all our Municipal Detachments will be receiving equipment in the next few years, with installation planned for Warman and Martensville Detachment in the current fiscal year.

It is important that our vehicles are properly equipped and that our members have the tools they require to meet the expectations of our communities and the judiciary. We are seeking

your support of the rollout of the in-car video program and the increase in expenditures within the current budget year.
